The Team, aside from singing in several churches in the city, led Music, Drama, English Class, and Dance workshops in a small Muslim community of 100 families. The Tausugs and Samals, our Muslim "cousins," received us with their tribal dances, songs and beautiful smiles. Although humidity and scorching heat was ever present, amazingly, everyone's energy was high 'til the end of the day!

Every night we had team debriefings, and those nights were the only chance for us leaders (the Dream Team as *Tita*

[Aunt] Ramona called us) to hear their thoughts. It was fun to hear how the day went and how their perception of "normal" changed. Some felt more fortunate because of the extreme poverty in the community. Some felt privileged to serve the needy youth and children there. Some were sad because they were not allowed to share the love of Isa (Jesus in Arabic) through words!

I was amazed at how an exposure trip can turn a young person's perspective 180 degrees! The Youth were uneasy because everything was new to them. And personally, I think uneasiness is good because that's the time your brain tells you to do something with what you feel. I'm discerning they have an increasing passion to share Isa's love. This is a good start, for they will definitely face a lot more opportunities as they continue their 2-year journey with the ministry.

180 Degrees Music Team is about challenging the youth of today to be involved in the "Missions" task – molding their ordinary lives into something valuable to the Lord and His redemption business. This task is too daunting for them to face alone and they can only do so much.

Prayers are needed for 180 Degrees Leaders as they continue to challenge and mentor these young people towards God's call in their lives.
