One thing that continues to inspire me is to see young people wholeheartedly serving the Lord and becoming passionate about

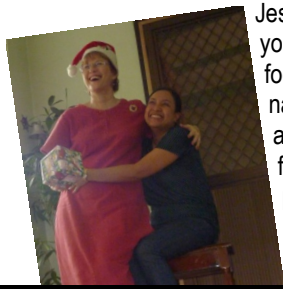
How about a turn-around parent? Once super-protective and a suspicious "shield" for his child, now a prayerful advocate!

Because of this pursuit, there came a point in my life when I started to think "I know everything about Christianity." But, boy, how wrong I was! Not only did I miss out on a lot of the more important things, but I realized that my heart really was not in-sync with God's heart.
